Pastor, Conference departmental director, Professor and University Administrator are just some of the roles that have been performed by Dr Orlando Moncrieffe over his forty-seven years of ministry within the Seventh-day Adventist Church internationally. During this time, Dr Moncrieffe, has pastored fifty-one congregations and conducted evangelistic meetings in more than 20 countries. He currently serves in the Allegheny East Conference as pastor of the Muungano Seventh-day Adventist Church in Jersey City, New Jersey, USA.

Born on the Bernard Lodge Sugar Estate in St. Catherine, Jamaica, Dr Moncrieffe holds the Bachelor of Theology degree from the former West Indies College (now Northern Caribbean University), the Master of Arts degree in Religion from Andrews University in Michigan, USA and the Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D) degree in Biblical Studies from Duke University. He and his wife, Dr. Maureen Moncrieffe, have five adult children and six grandchildren.

In recognition of his outstanding teaching and academic leadership over the years, Dr. Moncrieffe, has received numerous awards and citations. These include the Award for Distinguished Service by the Port Maria High School Alumni Association, the Teacher of the Year Award at Caribbean Union College and at Atlantic Union College the Academic Leadership Award (2001), Award for Excellence (2004), Most Popular Professor Award (2004), the President's Award for Teaching Excellence (2005).



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Dr. Moncrieffe has also received much recognition for services rendered to the wider community. He served for four years (1986-1990) as President of the United Nations Association of Jamaica and was head of Jamaica's delegation to the World Federation of United Nations Associations Plenary Sessions in Ottawa in 1987 and in Moscow in 1989. He was appointed by the Jamaican Government to the National Council for the International Year of Peace in 1986, and was honored with the Outstanding Service Award by the United Nations Association of Jamaica in 1993. He is listed in the Jamaica Directory of Personalities, the Lexington Who's Who Registry of Executives and Professionals, and Who's Who Among America's Teachers.


