After graduating from West Indies College (now Northern Caribbean University) with the Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing, she went on to pursue further studies, obtaining certification in nursing management from the University of the West Indies and the Master of Business Administration (MBA) from Northern Caribbean University.

Mrs. Morgan's professional experience includes not only regular hospital nursing care, but also service in the commercial sector. In 1989, she began her career at the Spanish Town Hospital and after two years, travelled to Canada where she worked at the rehabilitative centre from 1991 to 1992. Returning to Jamaica in 1992, she served as Charge Nurse at the Medical Associates Hospital until 1994 before transitioning into an administrative position at Nestle Jamaica Limited, serving for four years as Health and Welfare Manager.

An active member of the Palm Seventh-Day Adventist Church in Linstead, St. Catherine and a mentor, friend, confidant and surrogate parent to many, Mrs. Morgan has greatly impacted the lives of young people within her church as well as the surrounding communities. Her passion for extending care is not limited to the patients whom she may encounter at a bedside, but also for the professional and personal development of the nursing staff over whom she has leadership responsibility and her mentorship has helped to create a legacy of strong leaders wherever she serves.



Mrs. Morgan is happily married to Glenton for twenty-six years and their union has produced three children, all of whom have received or are receiving Christian education within the Seventh-day Adventist educational system. Mrs. Morgan firmly believes that her reasonable service is to embrace Christ-centred principles in her everyday interactions, in order to restore trust, instill a sense of belonging and inspire hope in those we seek to serve.

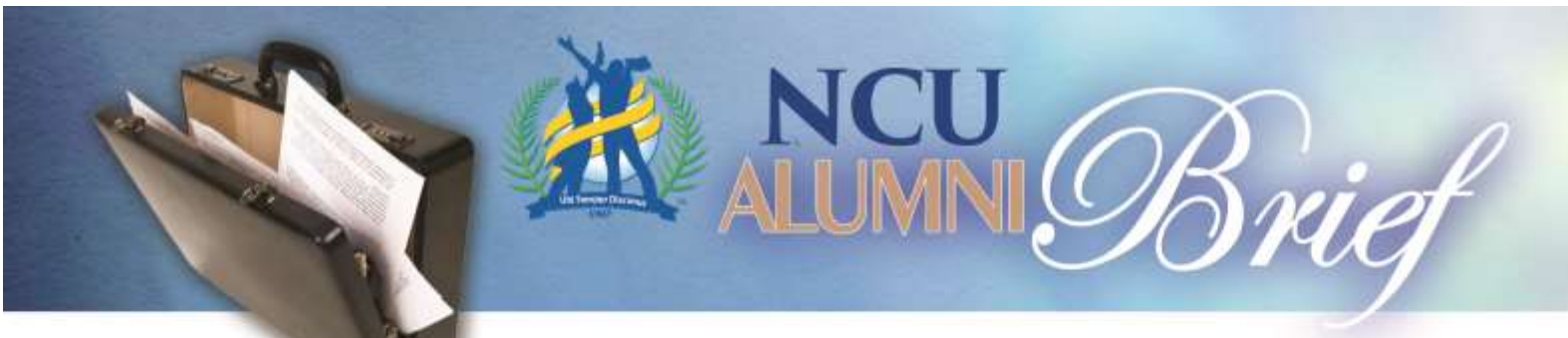
